

## Oregon Values & Beliefs Project – Survey 3 (of 3) Annotated Questionnaire

**Topics:** Feelings about community 10 years from now; general culture; 10 year trends: environmental protection/economic growth, growth management, health insurance, education delivery, religion and spirituality, Oregonians addressing critical issues; economic development, education, environment, health and healthcare conditions and behavior; demographics

## Research Design:

- Scientific random sample survey of 1,864 Oregonians in 5 regions of the state
- •
- Conducted May 2013
- Regional quotas based on 2010 Census Updates for age, gender to ensure representative samples within regions
- Regions proportionally weighted for statewide results per 2010 Census Updates
- 20 minute survey instrument with 87 closed and open-ended questions
- Quality control measures including pre-testing, questionnaire triangulation, validations, and monitoring calls completed for telephone surveys
- Overall margin of error +/- 2.3% at 95% confidence level


