


Figure 4. Majority agreement 78% (combining lean and strong)




Figure 5. Majority agreement 79% (combining lean and strong)




Figure 6. Majority agreement 76% (combining lean and strong)






Figure 7. Majority agreement 74% (combining lean and strong)








Figure 9. Majority agreement 66% (combining lean and strong)




Figure 10. Majority agreement 64% (combining lean and strong)
